

What Melbourne Riders Should Know After a Motorcycle Accident

For many riders, the practical difficulties begin after the immediate incident has been dealt with.

The First Priority Is Safety

After an accident, personal safety should always come first.

Riders should move to a safe location when possible, seek medical assistance when necessary and follow the appropriate emergency and reporting procedures.

A motorcycle should not be ridden simply because it appears to be capable of moving.

Damage may not always be immediately visible. Issues involving steering, suspension, brakes, wheels, frame components or controls can affect safety even when cosmetic damage appears limited.

Professional assessment is therefore important before returning a motorcycle to normal road use.

Motorcycle Damage Can Be More Than Cosmetic

Motorcycles can sustain damage in areas that are not immediately obvious.

A crash may affect the handlebars, forks, wheels, frame, suspension, braking components or electrical systems.

Even a low-speed incident can potentially alter alignment or damage components.

This is why riders should avoid assuming that a motorcycle is safe simply because it starts and moves under its own power.

A qualified motorcycle workshop can inspect the bike and determine what repairs may be required.

Understanding the Insurance Process

Insurance claims can be confusing, particularly immediately after an accident.

Riders may have questions about where their motorcycle should be taken, who will communicate with the insurer, what happens during the assessment and whether a replacement vehicle is available.

Replacement Motorcycles Can Help Keep Life Moving

For riders who rely on their motorcycle for commuting, being without transport can quickly become inconvenient.

Motery states that when a motorcycle or scooter accident was not the rider's fault, eligible customers may be entitled to a replacement motorcycle while repairs are being completed or while they are waiting for a total-loss payout.

The availability of a replacement vehicle will depend on the individual circumstances and relevant claim arrangements.

The broader point is that riders should ask about transport options rather than assuming they must simply go without a motorcycle throughout the repair process.

Choosing a Motorcycle Repairer

The choice of repairer can make a significant difference to the experience following an accident.

A motorcycle-specific workshop understands the construction and requirements of motorcycles and can assess components that may be overlooked by a general automotive repairer.

It can also help the rider understand which repairs are necessary and what the repair process involves.

Accident repairs can involve several steps.

Don't Ignore Minor Damage

A professional assessment can help identify whether the motorcycle has suffered damage that could affect its safety or performance.

Riders should also be alert to changes in steering, braking, vibration or handling after an incident.

What Riders Can Do Before an Accident Happens

Although nobody expects to be involved in a crash, preparation can make the aftermath easier.

Motorcycle owners should understand their insurance policy, keep relevant documents accessible and maintain their motorcycle in good mechanical condition.

It is also useful to know where a trusted motorcycle repairer is located before an accident occurs.

Regular Maintenance Still Matters

Accident preparedness begins long before an accident.

Maintaining tyres, brakes, suspension, lights and other safety-related components can help ensure the motorcycle is operating as intended.
