

Window Insert, Retrofit or Full Replacement? Carp's Complete Exteriors Guides Omaha Homeowners Through Winter Decisions

As colder weather and competing contractor pitches arrive together, a longtime Omaha-area specialist breaks down what homeowners are really choosing between window inserts, retrofit or full window replacement



landing in Omaha-area mailboxes at wildly different prices, homeowners are facing a confusing decision: should they choose a window **insert**, a **retrofit**, or a **full-frame window replacement**? Carp's Complete Exteriors, one of the metro's longest-standing exterior specialists, is stepping in to explain the difference and why the cheapest option often costs more in the long run.

The terms are frequently used interchangeably in sales pitches, but they describe very different work:

- **Window inserts (also called pocket or retrofit windows)** place a new window unit inside the *existing* frame. They're faster and cheaper — but they keep the old frame in place, which means any hidden rot or water damage stays behind the wall, the visible glass area shrinks, and no new flashing or waterproofing is installed.
- **Full-frame replacement** removes the window down to the opening, allowing the installer to inspect and repair hidden damage, add proper flashing and insulation, and seal the opening against Nebraska's freeze-thaw winters.

"Every week we walk into homes where someone was quoted an insert at half the price, and they had no idea what they were giving up," said Chad Carpender, co-owner of [Carp's Complete Exteriors](#). "The old frame and whatever rot or moisture is hiding in it, stays right where it is. We'd rather take the time to educate a homeowner and lose the quick sale than let them pay for the same window twice."

Chad Carpender notes the timing matters as much as the method. [Window replacement](#) demand holds steady through the colder months, and winter is often the best window to plan and lock in a project before the spring rush. Full-frame replacement, he adds, is also where homeowners see the biggest gains on drafts and heating bills, the details that get lost when a project is rushed or done on the cheap.

He also has a word of caution about the current market. With few recent hailstorms in the area, a number of contractors have expanded into siding and windows for the first time this year. "There's been a wave of companies adding these services to their menu, and some of the ads out there promise the same window for half the price," Carpender said. "Homeowners deserve to know the difference between a true specialist and someone learning on their house. Ask who's actually doing the install, ask how they handle the frame, and ask to see real local work."
